**THE QUEEN'S MEDICAL CENTER NAMES MATTHEW ING,
M.D., PHYSICIAN ADVISOR**

HONOLULU - The Queen's Medical Center has named **Matthew Ing, M.D.**, Physician Advisor.

As physician advisor, Dr. Ing will serve as a resource to both physicians and the Queen's care coordination team with a focus on resource management, patient flow, and regulatory requirements. He will support The Queen's Medical Center by exploring best practices, and working as a member of the care coordination team to optimize care delivery throughout the medical center.

His nearly 15 years as an emergency physician at Queen's allow him to be a strong advocate for patients, while his role as the emergency department medical director from 2009-2014, and now as president of The Emergency Group, has provided him with the insight and background to understand the challenges facing all care providers in the ever-changing landscape of health care.

Dr. Ing attended medical school at the University of Hawaii – John A. Burns School of Medicine and completed his residency training at the University of Connecticut Integrated Residency of Emergency Medicine. He has been a practicing Emergency Medicine physician at The Queen's Medical Center since 2003, and will continue to practice in the emergency department at both the Punchbowl and West Oahu campuses of The Queen's Medical Center.

Queen's is the only hospital in Hawaii to achieve Magnet® status – the highest institutional honor for hospital excellence – from the American Nurses Credentialing Center.
