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**THE QUEEN'S HEALTH SYSTEMS NAMES
ANNA LOENGARD, M.D. AS CHIEF MEDICAL OFFICER OF THE
QUEEN'S CLINICALLY INTEGRATED PHYSICIAN NETWORK**

HONOLULU – The Queen's Health Systems (QHS), corporate parent of The Queen's Medical Center, has named **Anna Loengard, M.D.** as Chief Medical Officer of the Queen's Clinically Integrated Physician Network (QCIPN). The Network is comprised of 300 Primary Care Physicians and 750 Specialists practicing across the State of Hawaii.

Loengard will work closely with Queen's physicians and their physician organizations to increase the quality of care, decrease the cost of care, and improve the health of the Network's patient population.

Loengard trained in internal medicine at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center at Harvard University and completed a geriatrics fellowship at the University of Arizona. After training, she returned to her native New York City and joined the Department of Geriatrics at Mount Sinai Medical Center. There she focused on Palliative care and home-based primary care for the frailest elderly.

In 2007, she founded Successful Caring, a company designed to educate caregivers to better navigate our healthcare system.

She and her family moved to Hawaii in 2009, where she became medical director for St. Francis Hospice. In 2011 she was named chief medical officer for St. Francis Healthcare System, where she focused on hospice, home health and the design of their kupuna-focused Liliha campus.

From February 2014 until joining the QCIPN, she was President of ClarisHealth Hawaii, a start up whose mission is to create innovative programs to care for the elderly and those with complex care needs.

Loengard is on faculty in the John A. Burns School of Medicine Department of Geriatrics and has received numerous teaching awards. She was named HAH "Physician of the Year" for 2013.

She lives in Kailua with her husband and two children.
